Lilli Ann Zahara Award:

The award is issued in memory of Lil Zahara as one of the first few women Public Health Inspectors in Canada and recipient of the Canadian Jubilee Medal by the Governor General. Current Environmental Health Practitioners are eligible annually for this \$500.00 award upon nomination. The criteria are dedication, commitment, inspiration and leadership in the field of Environmental Health, particularly with a commitment to food safety and/or health education.
