

LEN GALLANT, CPHI(C)

Leonard Gallant began his career in 1960 with the Prince Edward Island Department of Health. After qualifying for a Certificate in Sanitation Inspection in 1961, he served the Department as a field inspector, supervisor and then as manager of the environmental health programs. Over the years, he served on many committees on behalf of the department including serving for many years on two Federal/Provincial/Territories Committees.

Len has always been a strong advocate of the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors and in 1997 was awarded the Alex Cross Award from CIPHI for Displaying the Highest Standards of Professional Practice, and in 2003 the Life Membership Award from CIPHI.

Following his retirement in 2003, Len was requested by the Public Health Agency of Canada to bring together retired representatives from each provinces to form what is now the CIPHI Retirees Advisory Committee of which he is the Past Chair. In addition he was also charged with organizing the public health educational facilities into a group that is now known as the Consortium of Public Health Educators. Len has also been an avid supporter of ongoing education, and served on the CIPHI steering committee and working group for the implementation of the Core Competency Program (CoPE), and is currently a member.

Len was recognized by the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors for his dedication to the Institute when he received his 50 Year Member Award at a CIPHI event during Environmental Public Health Week in Charlottetown.



### **AWARDS**

#### **EHFC Continuing Education Award:**

A \$500 award and certificate is presented annually to a CIPHI (regular) member. Applicants must be working in the environmental public health field and a CIPHI member in good standing for five (5) consecutive years. The applicant may be enrolled in a single course or a program.

#### **Len Hiebert Environmental Health Review Award:**

A \$250 award and certificate is presented to a student or team of students conducting a research project in each of the five accredited public health inspection programs in Canada.

#### Lilli Ann Zahara Award:

A \$500 award and certificate is presented annually to a CIPHI (regular) member. Applicants must be working in the environmental public health field and a CIPHI member in good standing for five (5) consecutive years. The recipient shall display the highest level of dedication, commitment, inspiration and leadership in the field of environmental health, particularly with a focus on food safety and/or health education.

#### **National Sanitation Foundation International Food Safety Award:**

A \$1,000 award and certificate is presented annually to a CIPHI (regular) member in recognition of outstanding contributions to the promotion of food safety in Canada. Applicants must be working in the environmental public health field and a CIPHI member in good standing for five (5) consecutive years.

#### **Canadian Water and Wastewater Association Water Safety Award:**

This is a new award in recognition of outstanding contributions to the promotion of drinking or recreational water safety in Canada. A \$500 award and certificate will be presented annually to a CIPHI (regular) member. Applicants must be working in the environmental public health field and a CIPHI member in good standing for five (5) consecutive years.

#### NCCEH STUDENT PROJECT AWARD

This student award project is offered by the National Collaborating Centre for Environmental Health (NCCEH) in partnership with the Environmental Health Foundation of Canada (EHFC) and takes the form of a contest held once a year for students enrolled in environmental health programs across Canada.

The project objectives is to: promote evidence-based practice and policy among students and schools; recognize quality student work; share quality student projects with EH professionals across the country.

Annually, Canadian schools of Environmental Health program/department are invited to submit up to three student projects by May 31st. Submissions are be reviewed by a panel with the award-winning projects posted on the NCCEH and EHFC websites. A prize of \$200 is presented for each of the 15 top projects (group projects are considered as one).

The project must be relevant to EH practice or policy in Canada; project topic should be a priority for practitioners/policymakers; and could be in the form of an evidence review or as research.

# EHFC TempSafe®







The Environmental Health Foundation of Canada (EHFC) developed the *TempSafe®* products to enhance food safety education strategies and to ensure that temperature control messages continue to be emphasized after food safety inspections and food handler training. The *TempSafe®* symbols provide consistent, clear and simple messaging and are trademarked and available in both official languages.

These products are fully customizable with specific health agency information and are available as fridge magnets, lapel pins, static clings, displays and posters. The symbols are great assets in the Environmental Public Health Professional food safety tool box.

The TempSafe® products have been widely used by several agencies across Canada including:

- Several Ontario and BC health units
- Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC) in for Farmers' Markets and Community Group/Church education packages
- Canadian Partnerships for Consumer Food Safety Education's "Food Safety at Home--You're in Control" and "Chill Out" initiative
- First Nations and Inuit Health, Health Canada in Manitoba and Ontario

#### PARTNERSHIP WITH ONTARIO MINISTRY OF HEALTH & LONG TERM CARE

During 2012, the Ontario Ministry of Health & Long Term Care (MOH&LTC) and the EHFC partnered in a very successful province-wide promotion of the *TempSafe®* products with eleven Ontario health units taking advantage of the promotion. The printer provided large volume discounts and for each health unit with a minimum \$1,500 order of any combination of *TempSafe®* products, the MOH&LTC covered \$500 of each order.


In 2012, a total of sixteen Ontario health units purchased *TempSafe®* products which given their service area, covered approximately 70% of Ontario's population.

The *TempSafe*<sup>®</sup> symbols are used as prompts and reminders for storing food safely. They can be worn by food handlers and attached on the outside of fridges, coolers, freezers and on hot display tables/units. Using these symbols will serve as a prompt to operators/food handlers to check and confirm food temperatures.

#### EHFC FUNDING FOUNDER FOR NEW WATERCAN PROJECT, "CLEAN WATER FOR HEALTH"

Clean Water for Health projects address the appalling water and sanitation conditions in east African health clinics in an effort to reduce the water- and sanitation-related health risks to patients, health workers and caregivers in health care institutions.

Unfortunately, far too many health facilities in East Africa are burdened with appalling water and sanitation conditions, contributing to sickness and disease among both patients and health workers. The very places where children, women and men go to be treated become places that hold great potential for spreading disease.

Given the huge challenge of improving safe water supply and sanitation coverage rates, national governments in East Africa have created enabling environments for international development partners such as WaterCan and local non-governmental organizations to facilitate the provision of water supply and sanitation services to underserved communities.

EHFC Trustees Cameron Coulby and Pamela Scharfe attended the 25th anniversary celebrations of WaterCan in Ottawa on June 14, 2012 to present a \$2,000 cheque to launch the new "Clean Water for Health" project. The program aims to work with existing partners to develop improved water, sanitation and hygiene in health clinics.


